



OLD SALEM CHRISTMAS **TANGLEWOOD FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS** **AND CHRISTMAS AT BILTMORE**

Journey to North Carolina for a first class tour to kick off the holiday season at **Old Salem, Tanglewood** and **Biltmore Estates**. Begin your adventure at **Chinqua-Penn Plantation**, a 1,000-acre estate named for the chinquapin tree, completed in 1926 by Thomas Jefferson Penn and his wife. The estate reflects their elaborate and exciting 1920's lifestyle of travel, entertaining and collecting of global artifacts. Following the tour you will head to the Salem Inn located in Winston-Salem, North Carolina our home for the next three nights. Dinner this evening is included at **The Vineyards at Reynolda Village**.

The second day begins at the **Winston-Salem Visitors Bureau** for a unique film introducing you to the history, culture and charm of this vibrant city nestled in the foothills of the Blue Mountains. Visit **Historic Bethabra**, which was the first settlement in the area, settled by the Moravians in 1753. Here you will be entertained by a local Moravian storyteller who will share some of the Christmas stories from a bygone era. Following lunch enjoy a tour of **Old Salem**, a backcountry German congregation town which will be decorated with traditional Moravian stars, candles, illuminations and pyramids. A visit to the **Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts** will complete your visit to Old Salem. Dinner this evening is included at the **Barn Dinner Theater**.



The next day your first stop is **Replacements, Ltd.** It is a new modern facility, over 225,000 square feet featuring over 3,250,000 beautiful things to see and buy. It has the world's largest inventory of discontinued and active porcelain, bone china, earthenware and crystal stemware, as well as sterling, silverplate and stainless steel flatware. Enroute to Salisbury you visit **Josephus Hall House Museum**, once home to Dr. Josephus Hall, Chief Surgeon at the Salisbury Confederate Prison during the Civil War. Also included is a stop at The **North Carolina Transportation Museum**. It offers an interesting tour featuring not only train history but also antique automobiles. The museum is located on the site of what was once Southern Railway Company's largest steam locomotive facility. Dinner this evening is at the **Tanglewood Clubhouse** before viewing the **Tanglewood Festival of Lights**, one of the country's largest and most exciting displays of Christmas lights. Tanglewood is a beautiful 1,150-acre recreational facility originally owned by the Reynold's family. The facilities range from a rustic barn to the fine Manor House – all decorated for the season. A definite highlight of the tour!



The Biltmore Estate in Asheville, where "The Driveway is Measured In Miles and The Floor Plan Is Measured in Acres" is your focal point today. Begin your visit at the **Biltmore Winery** before heading to the estate. A self-guided tour of the holiday decorated 250-room mansion is scheduled, as well as time for exploring the unique shops. Worth the whole trip.
