Historic Civil War Trails

Metropolitan Richmond is a city of contrasts...Victorian opulence and colonial simplicity...Art Deco and Greek Revival...Grand estates and elegant townhouses...history and beauty...there are no limits to what you can see and do! Experience some of the history and stroll the paths of some glorious gardens in Virginia's capital!

Upon arrival in Richmond, you will tour **Agecroft Hall & Gardens**. Agecroft is a 15th-Century English manor house transported to Richmond stone by stone in 1925. Its 23-acre grounds, designed by noted landscape architect Charles Gillette, are a gardener's paradise. After checking into your hotel and some time to relax, we will be transported to the **Swift Creek Playhouse**, a restored 17th-Century gristmill for a Virginia-style **dinner and show**.

Rise and shine for an included **breakfast** followed by a visit to **Festival of Flags** and **Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens**. Here you will have an opportunity to stroll through winding paths and see eight main garden areas. You will be able to enjoy lunch on your own at **Shockoe Slip**, one of Richmond's most fashionable shopping and entertainment areas. The afternoon will include a visit to the **Museum and White House of the Confederacy**. The White House was home to Confederate



President Jefferson Davis. We will also tour the **State Capitol**, designed by Thomas Jefferson. **Dinner** will be included tonight followed by a visit to the historic Jefferson Hotel. Enjoy another included **breakfast** before setting off for **St. Johns Church**, site of patriot Patrick Henry's "Give me liberty or give me death" speech. We will have lunch at **Pamplin Park Civil War Site** with a stop at **Petersburg Battlefield**. Pamplin Park is a unique museum that combines the drama of those turbulent years of 1864 and 1865 with the technology of the 21st-century to present Civil War history. Here we will explore the plantation, encampment and battlefield as interpreters take us back to that fateful day in April 1865. Our touring during the day will

help prepare us for a fantastic **Civil War-theme dinner** included at the Patrick Henry Inn tonight.

This specially arranged tour includes three nights lodging, room tax, luggage handling, three dinners (including one with show and one Civil War-theme dinner), three breakfasts, meal tax and tips, Agecroft Hall and its gardens, a show at the Swift Mill Creek Playhouse, Festival of Flags, Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens, the White House of the Confederacy, tour of the State Capitol, St. Johns Church, lunch and tour at Pamplin Park, Petersburg Battlefield, a narrated driving tour of Richmond, the Virginia Historical Society/The Museum of Virginia History, guide gratuity, and round trip motor coach transportation.
