

# BARTRAM'S HOUSE & GARDEN TOUR AND THE SCOTT ARBORETUM



Join your friends and members for a trip to Philadelphia to visit Bartram's Garden. The **homestead of John Bartram** (1699-1777), America's first botanist, co-founder of the American Philosophical Society, and a towering figure in colonial Philadelphia's scientific community, is America's oldest living botanical garden. The 45-acre site on the Schuylkill River in Southwest Philadelphia features Bartram's 18th-century home and farm buildings, historic botanical garden, wildflower meadow, water garden, freshwater wetland, parkland, river trail and a museum shop. The house was named a National

Historic Landmark in 1963.



A delicious **lunch is included** at one of the many restaurants in Philadelphia. After lunch continue to the **Scott Arboretum** of Swarthmore College. The Scott Arboretum is a garden of ideas and suggestions. Encompassing more than 300 acres of the Swarthmore College campus and exhibiting over 4,000 kinds of ornamental plants, the Arboretum displays some of the best trees, shrubs, vines and perennials for use in the region.
